REPORT OF STATED CLERK – TE Bill Dudley, Stated Clerk

RE David Dennis of Grace Church in Franklin, TN opened with prayer for the report of the Stated Clerk.

1. UPDATE was given by the Stated Clerk regarding the potential property lawsuit against Bethany Church in Kingsport, TN by the Holston Presbytery of PCUSA. The lawsuit was initiated by Holston Presbytery (PCUSA) over the title/ownership of church property.

The original offer from PCUSA to Bethany was:

Purchase	\$461,000
Lease	\$ 500/month
Vacate Property	September 15, 2018

Bethany did not vacate by September 15 and offered PCUSA \$46,000 (cash); this offer was rejected by PCUSA.

Recent communications have been sent to Presbytery TEs and Sessions from Bethany pastor, TE Daniel Cheevers. The lawsuit has been reignited with depositions originally scheduled for April 21, 2021. The Bethany Session has continued meeting to consider their options, and the two pastors, Daniel and Leslie

Cheevers, met for a cordial greeting with the Presbytery Executive of Holston Presbytery (PCUSA).

TE Margaret Ferguson led the court in a time of prayer for the Bethel congregation, the pastors, and a resolution to this difference with Holston Presbytery.

2. RETIREMENT SERVICE for TE Jeff Chadwick was celebrated.
TE Bill Dudley presented Jeff Chadwick and his wife, Donna, to the court and gave a biographically overview of Jeff's life and ministry. TE Jeff Jeremiah, GA Stated Clerk, served for several years with Chadwick in the GA office; the Stated Clerk expressed thanks for Chadwick's leadership and gifts and made personal comments related to their friendship. Leaders and members of First Church in Rome, GA were invited to gather around Jeff and Donna and to lay hands upon him as the GA Stated Clerk led in prayer.

ADDENDUM 3

Church Planting and Receiving Report

POSE, Saturday, May 2nd, 2021

While the Committee for Church Planting and Receiving has not had a great deal of work to do this past quarter, we have not been completely idle. Please allow me to give you a brief summary of what we have been up to:

- 1) TE Grady Davidson and I met with Pastor Doug Nelms of Renovation Church Atlanta back in January regarding their hoped for reception into the Presbytery of the Southeast. Pastor Leonce' Crump reported that their congregational informational meeting, held after the February POSE meeting at FPC Thomasville, did not go as smoothly as hoped for. We continue to offer support and help in any way we can, and pray for Pastor Leonce' and Pastor Doug as they navigate this uncertain situation.
- 2) On March 31st, RE Palmer Griffin (Chair of Church Health and Growth) and I met with RE David Peterson from Hope Fellowship, Chickamauga, to discuss their efforts at identifying and electing RE's. We discussed CP/R assisting in the training of these officers. He was receptive to the idea.
- 3) The Administrative Commission established by POSE to provide oversight and guidance to Resurrection Chattanooga has been meeting regularly. Currently, one of their biggest issues has been the meeting space they are currently leasing and whether they need to move to another space to further their ministry and growth.
- 4) TE Andy Cornett and I met to clarify how CP/R and Project 2028 will work together moving forward. In essence: Project 2028 will identify and nurture Church Planters until the church plant can become a Mission Church. Then, CP/R will take the baton and provide whatever help and guidance is necessary (POSE Commission, membership process, training Elders, etc...) to help the Mission Church become a Local Church.
